★ STATE FLOWER ★ Saguaro Cactus Blossom



The Saguaro cactus blossom is the official state flower of Arizona.

The Saguaro cactus blossom became the official state flower of Arizona in 1931.

The blossoms grow on the Saguaro cactus, one of the largest cacti in the U.S.

Saguaro cactus blossoms grow near the tops of the cactus's arms & trunk.



After a blossom is pollinated, it develops into a Saguaro fruit.



Bats are one of the main pollinators of Saguaro cactus blossoms.

One Saguaro cactus can produce dozens of blossoms in one season.

Saguaro cactus blossoms usually bloom in the **late spring**. The blossoms only bloom for about **24 hours**.

CAPITAL CITY Phoenix

Phoenix is the **LARGEST** city in Phoenix with a population of over 1.8 million people.

Phoenix became an official city of Arizona in 1856 & was chosen as the capital city in 1889.

Phoenix is the largest city by population in the U.S.

Phoenix is one of the **hottest** cities in the U.S.

Phoenix is the only city in the U.S. that has a desert climate.

Phoenix has over 300 sunny days per year.

Phoenix is surrounded by mountains, including the famous Camelback Mountain.

Phoenix has a population of over 1.8 million people.

SMALL TOWN Williams

Williams is a small town in Arizona with a population of over 3,300 people.

Williams is known as the "Gateway to the Grand Canyon."

Williams is located along the historic Route 66.

Williams has a rich history in the lumber industry.

Williams was the starting point for the Grand Canyon Railway.

Williams is one of the few Arizona towns that regularly gets snow in the winter.

Williams Unified School District has around 400 students.

London Bridge

The London Bridge is a historic bridge located in Lake Havasu City, Arizona.

The bridge was taken apart in London and placed in Lake Havasu City, where it was rebuilt stone by stone.

The London Bridge is about 900 feet long.

The London Bridge took 9 years to build in Lake Havasu City.

The London Bridge is often called the "world's largest antique."

Grand Canyon NATIONAL PARK

The Grand Canyon is one of the seven natural wonders of the world.

The Grand Canyon is a 277-mile-long canyon carved by the Colorado River.

Scientists believe the Grand Canyon began forming 6-8 million years ago.

At its widest point, the Grand Canyon stretches about 18 miles across.

The Grand Canyon is known for its colorful rock layers shaped by millions of years of erosion.
