Manatee

The manatee is the official state marine mammal of Florida.

The manatees found in Florida are a subspecies of the **West Indian manatee**.

Florida manatees live in **warm, shallow waters** like rivers, bays & coastal areas.

Manatees are **slow swimmers**, usually going **3 - 5 miles per hour**.

Manatees are nicknamed "**sea cows**" because of their size & eating habits.

Manatees are **herbivores** - meaning they only eat plants like **seagrass & algae**.

The average manatee weighs around **1,000 pounds**.
