

Played a key role in drafting the Constitution.



The Father of Our Country

Commonly referred to as "Lady Washington".

Martha is one of only two women (the other being Pocahontas) to have appeared on U.S. paper currency.

Born on February 22, 1732, in Westmoreland Co, VA.

GEORGE

Died December 14, 1799.

Oct. 17,1781

Led the continental army to victory over the British.




John Adams

John Adams

President to live in the White House.

Participated in drafting the Declaration of Independence



Adams' son became the 6th President of the United States.

Graduated from Harvard College in 1755.

ABIGAII

Born on October 30, 1735, in Braintree (Quincy), MA.

Died July 4, 1826.

Established a naval force when the threat of war with France with looming.



Father of the Navy



ADAMS

Abigail was a big advocate for women's access to education.

With no access to education herself, Abigail was self-taught from the books in her father's library.

Adams was a hopeless romantic and wrote

THOUSANDS

of love letters to his wife.



2nd President

Thomas Jefferson


3rd President ★ 1801 - 1809

Gifted a

piece book collection to the Library of Congress after it was raided in 1814.

Before becoming President, Jefferson was a part of drafting the Declaration of Independence.



Born on April 13, 1743, in Goochland (Albemarle) County, VA.

Died July 4, 1826.

The Pen of the Revolution

Completed the Louisiana Purchase in

1803

this doubled the size of the U.S. at the time.



MARTHA

JEFFERSON

Martha did not live to see Jefferson become President.

No facial image of Martha remains. This painting of her was created based off modern descriptions of her physical attributes.

After the Louisiana Purchase, Jefferson sent two people out to explore the new territory.

3rd President

James Madison

4th President 🜟 1809 - 1817

"The happy Union of these States is a wonder; their Constitution a **miracle**; their example the hope of Liberty throughout the world."

James Madison

Issued until 1969, the

\$5,000

bill featured a Madison's portrait.

Historians believe that Madison wrote George Washington's first inaugural address.

The SHORTEST president.

Father of the Constitution

Dolley began the tradition of inaugural balls and was the first to redecorate the White House.

When the British invaded D.C. during the War of 1812, Dolley saved valuables from the White House before it was burned down.

Virginia

Born on March 16, 1751, in Port Conway, VA.

Died June 28, 1836.

Madison took part in writing the Federalist Papers alongside Alexander Hamilton & John Jay to promote the ratification of the Constitution.

Madison and George Washinaton were the **ONLY** presidents who signed the Constitution.





Purchased Florida from Spain for \$5,000,000,000 at this time, Florida became a territory of the U.S., but was not admitted as a state until 1845.

The Monroe **Doctrine**

A policy created to stop other nations from interfering with the Western hemisphere.

5th President

John Quincy Adams

6th President 🛨 1825 - 1829

Vice President – John C. Calhoun

"If your actions **inspire** others to **dream** more, **learn** more, **do** more and **become** more, you are a **leader**." John Quincy Adams



President whose father was also President in the past – John Adams.

First became a lawyer after receiving his Masters from **Harvard**.

As the Secretary of State under James Monroe, Adams helped draft the **Monroe Doctrine**.



Born on July 11, 1767, in Braintree (Quincy), MA.

Died February 23, 1848.

ONLY

President to enter Congress **after** their Presidential term – became a representative for

Massachusetts

Old Man Eloquent



LOUISA

The first First Lady to be born outside of the United States.

Born in London, Louisa did not move to the U.S. until 4 years after marrying John Quincy Adams. 18

Adams served in the House of Representatives for 18 years.

Andrew Jackson

7th President 🛨 1829 - 1837



"I was born for the **storm**, and a **calm** does not suite me."

Andrew Jackson

At the age of 13


(1780), Jackson and his brother joined the local militia.

> In 1781, they were captured by the British, making Jackson the **ONLY** President to have been a prisoner of war.

Jackson never had any children of his own, but he adopted three sons and was the legal guardian for eight other children.

First president to suffer an **assassination** attempt.

Old Hickory

Rachel died before Jackson's Presidential inauguration.

The duties of the First Lady then fell to Rachel's niece, Emily Donelson.



Born on March 15, 1767, in Waxhaw Settlement, SC

Died June 8, 1845.

Known as the first "common man" to be elected president.

Tennessee's first member of the U.S. House of Representatives.

Jackson led his troops to victory against the British in the Battle of New Orleans in 1815.

Martin Van Buren

8th President ★ 1837 - 1841

Died July 24, 1862.

The **FIRST** President to be born as a **U.S.** citizen. All previous presidents were born as British subjects.

Van Buren's son married Angelica Singleton in 1838 and Angelica was the one who took on the roles of the First Lady.

One of Van Buren's primary concern while in office - this was when the stock market crashed, and an economic depression began.

9th President 🛨 March 4 – April 4, 1841

Harrison gave the

LONGEST

Ever inaugural address -1 hour & 45 minutes.

Originally, Harrison wanted to be a **doctor** and attended **Pennsylvania Medical School** before dropping out to join the military.

William and Anna eloped and got married in secret.

Born on February 9, 1773, in Berkeley, VA.

Died April 4, 1841.

Harrison was the

SHORTEST

serving President in U.S. history. Just 1 month after taking office, Harrison fell victim to a fatal case of pneumonia.





ANNA

Anna who delayed her move to Washington due to illness, but never made it there before Harrison passed.

Congress voted to give Anna a pension equivalent to Harrison's salary, thus setting a precedent for the pensions of subsequent first ladies.

William & Anna. had 10 kids. Their 5th child, John is the father of the 23rd President, Benjamin Harrison.

John Tyler

10th President ★ 1841 - 1845

Vice President – None

"Nature governs man by no principle more fixed than that which leads him to pursue his interest."

John Tyler

Virginia

1845

Signed a bill that admitted Florida and Texas into the Union.

Tyler's presidency is not seen in high regard.


Born on March 29, 1790, in Charles City County, VA.

Known as the "Rose of Long Island".

Julia and John were the first couple to marry while holding the presidential office.

Because of this, his entire cabinet resigned, and he was expelled from the Whig party.

James K. Polk

11th President 🛨 1845 - 1849

"Peace, plenty, and contentment reign throughout our borders, and our beloved country presents a sublime moral spectacle

to the world."

James K. Polk

Before his presidency, Polk served as Speaker of the House from

1835-1839

Then leaving that role to become the Governor of Tennessee.

Sarah was highly educated and attended one of the few high level education centers for women – The Moravians' Female Academy.

Sarah used her education to help Polk write his speeches. But this had to be done in private because women had no role in politics at the time.

> > Died June 15, 1849.

Polk's presidential nomination came as a

SURPRISE

to everyone, including himself.

Manifest **Destiny**

Polk believed in this theory and the idea that the United States was destined to expand across North America.







Zachary Taylor

12th President ★ 1849 - 1850

Vice President – Millard Fillmore

"Never judge a stranger by their clothes."

Taylor was known for appearing "disheveled", wearing a straw hat and farm clothes under his officer's jacket.

Taylor never attended college.

Grew up in the frontier country and had little formal education.

"Old Whitey"

Taylor's horse was kept on the front lawn of the White House.

Zachary Taylor **Virginia**

Born on November 24, 1784, in Orange County, VA.

Died July 9, 1850.

Served 40 t

years in the army.

Taylor's
willingness to
share the
hardships of field
duty with his
men earned him
his nickname.



Old Rough & Ready



Margaret went by "Peggy".

Peggy fell ill and left most of her duties to her daughter, Betty Taylor.

Fought in **FOUR** wars:

- 1. War of 1812
- 2. Black Hawk War
- 3. Second Seminole War
- 4. Mexican-American War

Millard Fillmore

13th President 🜟 1850 - 1853

"It is not strange...to make change for progress.

Did not begin formal school until the age of

Fillmore then ended up marrying his teacher -Abigail Powers.

Self-Taught Lawyer

Passed the exam to practice law at age 23, and then opened his own law firm near Buffalo, NY.

Last of the Whigs


Abigail was the first First Lady to hold a job after marriage.

Abigail kept her career of being constant eagerness to learn and the love of teaching others. Millard & his wife created their own

White House Library with a collection of 1,050 **books** personally selected by them both.

Millard Fillmore **New York** Born on January 7, 1800, in Cayuga County, NY. Died March 8, 1874. One of the

Presidents to not be formally elected into office - Filmore became President after Zachary Taylor's unexpected death.

Franklin Pierce

14th President 🛨 1853 - 1857

Vice President – William R. King

"If your past is limited, your future is boundless."

Franklin's inaugural speech was

3,319 words & given

all from memory – **NO NOTES.**

Purchased land in the Southwest which today includes southern New Mexico and Arizona for

\$10,000,000

First president to put a Christmas tree in the White House.



New Hampshire

Franklin Pierce

Born on November 23, 1804, in Hillsboro, NH.

Died October 8, 1869.

Pierce did not have a **middle name**.



JANE

4 EANS PIERCE

Purse ·

The death of Jane's third child occurred right before Pierce's inauguration.

The whole nation shared in Jane and Franklin's grief.

pronounced his last name.

"Purse" is how Franklin

Kansas-Nebraska Act

Supported this act which put an end to the Missouri Compromise and allowed states to choose whether they would allow slavery or not. This set the stage for the **Civil War.**



James Buchanan

15th President 🛨 1857 - 1861

Vice President – John C. Breckinridge

"The test of **leadership** is not to put **greatness** into **humanity**, but to **elicit** it, for the **greatness** is already **there**."

James Buchanan

During Buchanan's administration, the

Union broke apart.

By the end of his term,





Supported this ruling which stated that the federal government had **no power to ban slavery**. Although Buchanan himself was against slavery, he believed strongly in the law and wanted to avoid Civil War at all costs.

16th President 🛨 1861 - 1865

Abraham Lincoln

Kentucky

Born on February 12, 1809, in Hodgenville, KY.

Died April 15, 1865.

First president to be born outside of the original 13 colonies.

The TALLEST President

April 14, 1865

Established the U.S. Secret Service ironically, same day of his assassination.

Honest Abe

Mary was known to be a "vivacious, intelligent and witty" woman.

During the Civil War, Mary volunteered as nurse in the Union army hospitals.

Lincoln issued the

Emancipation Proclamation

on **January 1, 1863,** that began the process of freeing all slaves across the U.S.

Andrew Johnson

17th President 🛨 1865 - 1869

"Honest conviction is my courage; the

Constitution is my guide."

Andrew Johnson




Johnson moved to Tennessee as a teenager where he started his own successful tailoring business.

During the Civil War,

Johnson was the **ONLY** southern legislator to continue working for the U.S. government after his state of Tennessee

left the Union.

Purchased Alaska from Russia for \$7.2 million in GOLD.



North Carolina

> Born on December 29, 1808, in Raleigh, NC.

> > Died July 31, 1875

First U.S. president to be impeached.

> Johnson won his trial and was allowed to remain in office.



ELIZA

The Veto President



Johnson never went to school – Eliza taught Johnson to read and write more fluently as well as how to do arithmetic. Johnson vetoed legislation that Congress passed to protect the rights of those who had been freed from slavery.

This resulted in the House of Representatives voting, on Feb. 24, 1868, to impeach Johnson.



Ulysses S. Grant

18th President 🛨 1869 - 1877

Vice Presidents – Schuyler Colfax & Henry Wilson

"In **every** battle there comes a time when **both** sides consider themselves **beaten**. Then he who **continues** the attack **wins**."

Ulysses S. Grant

Hiram is his legal first name, NOT Ulysses – **Hiram Ulysses Grant.**

The **S** in Ulysses S. Grant also does not stand for anything.



1872

Grant signed legislation making

Yellowstone the FIRST national park.

This also established the **National Park System.**

JULIE

DENT GRAN



In her words, Julie's time in the White House was "the happiest period" of her life.

Julie was a very popular hostess known for entertaining extensively and lavishly.

Ohio



Died July 23, 1885.

Grant's face appears on the front of the **50-dollar bill**.

Rutherford B. Hayes

19th President 🛨 1877 - 1881

Vice President – William A. Wheeler

"To vote is like the payment of a debt, a duty never to be neglected, if its performance is possible."


Rutherford B. Hayes

The first annual White House Ester Egg roll was held on

April 22, 1878

when Hayes agreed to open the White House grounds on Easter Monday.

Hayes is known
for winning one of
the closest

history. Many
believe he won by
fraud, earning

nickname.





Born on October 4, 1822, in Delaware, OH.

Died January 17, 1893.

1877

Hayes ordered the last of the federal troops to leave the Southern states.

The "B" in Rutherford B. Hayes stand for **Birchard**.

His Fraudulency



LUCY

Lucy was the first first lady to have earned a college degree.

Lucy drew attention to the importance of those who came before her and set precedents for those who came after. Hayes wrote about Lucy in his diary -

"Her low sweet voice is very winning.... A heart as true as steel.... Intellect she has too.... By George! I am in love with her!"

19th President

James Garfield

20th President ★ 1881

Vice President - Chester Arthur

"If wrinkles must be written on our brows, let them not be written upon the heart. The spirit should never grow old."

James Garfield




There were 6 presidents born in a **log cabin**, and Garfield was the last one.

Garfield's presidency only lasted **200** days before he was assassinated on July 2,1881.

Garfield stated the end of slavery being "the most important political change" since the Constitution.


PCDOLPH GARFIET



Preacher President

Lucretia was said to "grow up to every new emergency with fine tact and faultless taste."

She proved this in the eyes of the nation, though she was always a reserved, self-contained woman.



Ohio

Born on November 19, 1831, in Orange, OH.

Died September 19, 1881.

Garfield was Civil War **hero**.

President Lincoln at the time convinced Garfield to resign from his military post and devote his time to advocating for Ohio in the House of Representatives.

Garfield was then re-elected into this position for 18 years before becoming President.

This also made Garfield the **ONLY** sitting House member to ever become President.

Chester Arthur

21st President ★ 1881 - 1885

Vice President – None

"Where you stand depends on where you sit."

Arthur graduated from Union College in New York and became a **teacher** before starting Law School.

1854

Arthur passed the bar exam and started practicing law in New York.

Working as an attorney in New York, Arthur won several high-profile **civil rights cases**.

Mary Arthur McElroy – Arthur's sister filled the role and duties of the first lady.

Chester Arthur



Born on October 5, 1830, in Fairfield, VT.

Died November 18, 1886.

Pendleton Civil Service Act

Arthur signed this bill into law that made the selection of government employees may only be selected by competitive exams instead of personal affiliations.



The name "Elegant Arthur" came from his appreciation for fashion. Throughout each day, Arthur changed his outfit for every occasion.

Arthur reportedly owned over

pairs of pants.



Grover Cleveland

22nd & 24th President * 1885 - 1889 / 1893 - 1897

Vice Presidents – Thomas Hendricks & Adlai Stevensor

"A cause worth **fighting** for is worth fight for **until the end**." Grover Cleveland

The **ONLY** President in American history to serve **non-consecutive terms**.

Stephen

Cleveland's legal name is actually **Stephen Grover Cleveland**.

1882

Became the mayor of Buffalo, New York.

1883

Became the governor of New York.





New Jersey

Born on March 18, 1837, in Caldwell, NJ.

Died June 24, 1908.

Cleveland's first career
was in education – he
was a teacher at the
New York Institute
for the Blind.

Vetoes

Grover the Good



Frances became the youngest first lady at the age of 21.

Frances became a very influential first lady. She set trends for hairstyles and fashion.

Cleveland was known for some of his controversial vetoes regarding Civil War veteran pensions.



The **only**President
to ever be **married IN**the White
House.

22nd & 24th President

Benjamin Harrison

23rd President + 1889 - 1893

Vice President – Levi P. Morton

"I pity the man that wants a coat so cheap that the man or women who produces the cloth with

starve in the process."

Harrison came from quite the famous political family with his great grandfather (Benjamin Harrison) signing the Declaration of Independence, his grandfather (William H. Harrison) being the 9th President of the United States and his father (John Harrison) a U.S. Congressman.

The first president to have his voice recorded.

The first president to have

in the White House.

The "human iceberg".

CAROLINE

Benjamin Harrison

Ohio

Born on August 20, 1833, in North Bend, OH.

Died March 13, 1901.

Graduated from

Miami University in Ohio
studying law.

Worked as a lawyer until the **Civil War** broke out and he **joined the Union Army.**

Signed the Sherman Antitrust Act

The Front Porch Campaigner



Caroline received a degree in music, art & literature from Oxford Female Institute.

Caroline also helped found the National Society of the daughters of the American Revolution (DAR).

Harrison received this nickname because during the 1888 election, he gave nearly 90 speeches from his front porch to crowds that gathered in his front yard.

23rd President

William McKinley

25th President ★ 1897 - 1901

Spanish-American War.

As a result of the war, the U.S. took control of Cuba. Puerto Rico.

Born on January 29, 1843, in Niles, OH.



Theodore Roosevelt

26th President ★ 1901 - 1909

"A vote is like a rifle: its usefulness depends upon the character of the user.'

The first president to fly in an airplane.

"Rough Riders"

When the Spanish-American war broke out, Roosevelt put together a volunteer company of cowboys, college football players, NYC police officers & Native Americans.

United States Forest Service

Roosevelt established 150 national forests and 5 national parks during his time in office.

Roosevelt went blind in his left eye during his term from a

Theodore Roosevelt



New York

Born on October 27, 1858, in New York, NY.

Died January 6, 1919.

"The first modern president."

Graduated from **Harvard University** but dropped out of grad school (at Columbia University) before he got his law degree.

Soon after, Roosevelt went out West to work as a cowboy & rancher.



This resulted in the creation of an official social staff and elevated the position of First Lady.

The "teddy bear" was named after Roosevelt.


First President to receive the **Nobel Peace Prize**

for negotiating an end to a war between Russia and Japan.

26th President

William Taft

27th President ★ 1909 - 1913

"I am in favor of helping the prosperity of all countries because, when we are all prosperous, the trade with each becomes more valuable to the other."

William Taft

The **ONLY**

president to serve on the Supreme Court after leaving office.

As the **Chief Justice**. this made Taft the only former president to swear in a new president.

> Taft swore in not one, but TWO presidents -Calvin Coolidge and Herbert Hoover

After presidency but before being the Chief Justice, Taft was a law professor at Yale.

Ohio

Born on September 15, 1857, in Cincinnati, OH.

Died March 8, 1930.

The first president to **own** a car.

At Yale, Taft was a heavyweight wrestling champion.

Big Bill

HERRON TAES

HELEN

Helen helped coordinate the planting of 3,000 Japanese cherry blossom trees around the Tidal Basin on the Washington D.C. National Mall.

These trees continue to be a tourist destination every spring when they are in bloom.

Taft was the **LAST** president to keep a cow at the White House to provide fresh milk.

> Started the tradition of throwing out the first ball of the MLB baseball season.

Woodrow Wilson

28th President ★ 1913 - 1921

"Friendship is the only cement that will ever hold the world together."

Woodrow Wilson

Taught as a political science professor for over 15 years at Princeton University.

Wilson's earliest memory as a child was hearing that **Abraham Lincoln** had been elected president and that war was coming.

Thomas

Wilson's legal name is actually Thomas Woodrow Wilson.

Born on December 28. 1856, in Staunton, VA.

Died February 3, 1924.

Wilson was president during World War I.

Virginia



Wilson's face appears on the front of the \$100,000 bill.

EDITH

OLLING WILSON

The Professor

Edith was Wilson's second wife and married during his first term.

When Wilson suffered from a major stroke in 1919, Edith pre-screened all matters of the state for the remainder of Wilson's second term.


A group of countries that helped to negotiate disputes and try to make peace in the world.
